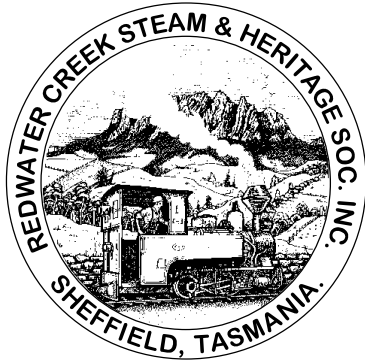

About the Society

The Society was formed in 1993 to preserve the skills and machinery of the steam era by forming a tourist attraction in Sheffield. In November 1993 society members began relocating and restoring the Sheffield Railway Station, constructing a 15 x 9m locomotive shed and 500m of two foot gauge track in time for the first SteamFest in March 1994.

In March 1996 the Society obtained planning approval for the first stage of its planned development thereby securing its site located at the corner of the Main Street and Spring Street (or Claude Road the main road to Cradle Mountain) in Sheffield for the development of the Redwater Creek Rail Steam & Heritage Museum. We currently have over 1km of track. The Society has 80 adult members, and has since its beginnings in 1993, been responsible for spending well over over \$250,000 on the site.
